



Research seminar and new projects at BALEX

During the autumn and winter, BALEX has emphasized its educational work, communications, new projects and public events. Three main research projects have been running in the period and a new international research seminar, which may be a forerunner to a more permanent course, will be held in Turku on 31 October 2017. BALEX has also actively been searching for new projects in the field of applied research. A project addressing the legal aspects of shipwrecks is under preparation and, as part of this, a seminar for state authorities and other interest groups who are working with shipwrecks in the Baltic Sea will be organized on 29-30 November 2017 in Helsinki, Finland, in co-operation with the Finnish Environment Institute Syke.

BALEX has received new funding from the foundation Merenkulun säätiö. We want to warmly thank them for enabling our extended functions! We have also hired a trainee, **Kati Heikkonen**, for the spring and the summer.

BALEX/Åbo Akademi University's part of the CompMon project has been brought to an end. The end report, addressing legal challenges linked to the enforcement of the new sulphur in fuel requirements for ships in the North Sea and Baltic Sea, is available on the Internet at www.compmon.eu/reports/.

A book on Baltic Sea law has been published in Finnish and another one, representing an outcome of the BaltReg project is currently being finalized. A short article about BALEX by Coordinator Saara Ilvessalo and Research Coordinator Henrik Ringbom was published in <u>Baltic Rim Economies</u>. A column by Coordinator Saara Ilvessalo in Finnish about the Baltic Sea regulation was also published in Centrum Balticum's "<u>Pulloposti</u>".

SHIPWRECK SEMINAR IN HELSINKI IN THE AUTUMN

A seminar with the topic **Wrecks as Environmental Risks:** The Legal Framework will be organized by BALEX and the Finnish Environment Institute Syke on 29-30 November 2017 in Helsinki, Finland. The focus is on clarifying the needs of international law, national legislation and the authorities in situations where the possibility to decontaminate (clean) wreck sites, and in particular the distribution of costs and responsibilities related to this, are problematic. The aim of the seminar is to shed light on the regulation concerning shipwrecks, highlight the existing problems and try to find solutions to them.

MULTIPLE LAYERS OF REGULATION: FOCUS ON THE BALTIC SEA REGION One-day research seminar, Turku 31 October 2017 Call for papers

The plan for the first research seminar organized by BALEX has proceeded. BALEX international research seminar will be held on 31 October in Turku with the topic **Multiple Layers of Regulation: Focus on the Baltic Sea Region**. We are happy to announce that the keynote speakers for the seminar have been confirmed and other arrangements are well on their way.









The keynote lectures are open events and are given by top experts in multi-level governance and the Baltic Sea: **Marja Lehto**, Dr., Ambassador, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Member of UN International Law Commission; **Mike Elliott**, Prof. Estuarine & Coastal Sciences, University of Hull, UK., Specialist in marine science-policy interactions; and **Anne Christine Brusendorff**, Dr., General Secretary, International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES).

The seminar also calls for research papers on various fields relating to the multi-level governance and/or the Baltic Sea to be discussed in workshops. We encourage scholars at different career stages and from different disciplines to participate in the keynote lectures and to submit their papers.

RESEARCH PROJECTS

2017 is the main year for the BaltReg project, addressing legal issues related to the governance of the Baltic Sea, in particular the interaction between multiple layers of rules and the role of other non-legal steering mechanisms. The main event will be an international conference on 23-25 August in Korppoo, Finland, but the team will host a specific working group on these issues at the 13th Nordic Environmental Social Science Conference in Tampere on 6-8 June 2017.

The AAWA project on unmanned ships is coming to an end this year, but another Tekes-funded project 'Design for Value' (D4V) dealing with similar issues from a broader perspective has already started. Both the University of Turku and Åbo Akademi participate in D4V. While many of the reports made in the context of the AAWA project are not in the public domain, a summary of the legal challenge work is made in the 'white paper', which is available here.

PAST ACTIVITIES

Since the previous edition of this Newsletter, BALEX has taken part in several events and activities. Among other things, BALEX gave a presentation of its function at the European Glögg Event of the Schuman Society in December in Turku and BALEX experts were sharing their experiences in Baltic Sea Future congress in Stockholm on 6-7 March 2017.

The Finnish Maritime Law Association, chaired by Henrik Ringbom, organized a new 7 ECTS pro bono course on maritime law for the universities in Turku in November. The initiative was closely linked to BALEX and was very successful with the course being fully booked. The lecturers were practicing maritime lawyers and persons linked to Finnish universities. A presentation of BALEX was given to the course by Saara Ilvessalo.

A Finnish book on Maritime Law and Baltic Sea ("Merioikeus ja Itämeri") by Henrik Ringbom and others and has been published and is available.
