

ERDF (€ million)	Total	Remaining
Priority 1 Innovation	84.4	23.3
Priority 2 Natural resources	84.4	18.5
Priority 3 Transport	66.0	15.7

Total ERDF for the third call: 57.5



Funding

- Norwegian funds EUR 2.7 million
- ENI and Russian funds EUR 5.1 million

Project partners

- At least 3 partners from 3 different countries
- Lead partner principle
- Types of partners:
- National, regional and local authorities
- Sectoral agencies and public service providers
- Higher education and research institutions
- Business support organisations
- NGOs
- Private for profit partners



Focus

 Increase institutional capacity of public authorities at all levels of governance

⇒Include public authorities with relevant roles in the partnership



Features of a successful project


- Clearly define:

 - Target groups and their needs
- Develop practical solutions, not focus on research
- Test solutions
- Involve target groups in developing and testing
- Embed developed solutions into existing frameworks, strategies, and programmes





Topics for cooperation

Capitalising projects' outcomes in selected areas:

- Smart specialisation (1.2)
- Clear waters (2.1)
- Blue growth (2.4)
- Interoperability (3.1)
- Maritime safety (3.3)
- Environmentally friendly shipping (3.4)



Outcomes

- Policy papers or studies on the state of play and needs
- Agreement on joint standards
- Best approaches to reaching end users
- Joint analysis of further potential financing sources
- Approaches to coordination of funding
- Political statements
- Task-oriented networks
- Models for sustainable exchange among platform partners



Examples of possible platform activities

- Synthesising project outcomes
- Mapping of the situation, resources and needs
- Benchmarking good practices of projects
- Exchanging approaches in communication/stakeholder involvement
- Establishing task-oriented networks
- Piloting mechanisms for coordination of funding and initiation of new collaboration
- Providing input to Programme communication


